DEFINITIONS

MAMMALS - vertebrates (that means 'animals with a backbone') that are warm-blooded and require air to breathe.

BIRDS - vertebrates (that means 'animals with a backbone') that are warm-blooded and require air to breathe. They also have feathers, wings and a beak.

FORESTS - an area of land mostly covered by trees.

RAINFORESTS - an area of land mostly covered by trees, that is mostly warm, and where it rains A LOT!

- All birds have wings and feathers, but not all birds can fly.
- All mammals produce milk to feed their young.
- The Galloway Forest Park in Scotland is the largest forest in all of the UK.
- There are 10 major rainforests in the world.
